Digital Spring Cleaning Tips

Digital spring cleaning is a simple way to take control of your online life by reviewing your accounts, organizing

your files and improving your online security. Over time, unused apps, old passwords and extra data can build up and create risks. Cleaning up your digital space helps protect your personal information, makes your devices run better and keeps your data easier to manage.

The National Cybersecurity Alliance recommends taking the following steps to keep your digital life secure: Update your passwords and use a [password manager](#).

Enable [multi factor authentication](#) on important accounts.

- Review app permissions and delete apps or accounts you no longer use
 - Keep your software updated and turn on automatic updates.
 - Back up important data.
- Securely dispose of old devices after wiping them.
- Clean up your email inbox and unsubscribe from newsletters you no longer read.
 - Organize files and remove duplicates.
 - Review your social media accounts and activity.
 - Cancel unused subscriptions.

COY MOUNTAIN – ALDEN, MICHIGAN Reuben Coy donated the property around 1895. Many changes have happened over the years. A more complete history is available at the trailhead in Alden.

Now it is a great dog friendly hiking loop with a view of Torch Lake from the top. It is approximately two miles in length. If you park at Tennis Courts you can tour Alden on your way to the trail head on Valley Road. Also, there are very nice bathrooms at the Tennis Courts. You can also park at the trail head.
